## FLOOD ADVISORY - UPDATE

Rivers and streams in the southern portion of the Kawartha Conservation watershed (Township of Scugog, geographic township of Manvers) have already peaked and are now receding quickly. Some minor flooding is still occurring in low-lying areas and areas with poor or restricted drainage.

Watercourses throughout the rest of the watershed (from south of Little Britain to Coboconk) are still experiencing high water levels, with localized flooding occurring in areas adjacent to waterbodies, low-lying areas and road ditches. Road flooding and washouts have been reported in some areas.

The weather forecast calls for warm daytime temperatures (up to 11°C) throughout the weekend and light rain is predicted for Friday, April 4<sup>th</sup> (3-5 mm). Under these circumstances, existing snow will continue melting and local watercourses are expected to maintain high water levels and velocities. No significant rise in water levels is expected, relative to current conditions.

**Municipalities are advised to monitor local watercourses closely and to be prepared to respond to flooding emergencies as they occur.** Residents are recommended to monitor the local situation closely and contact their municipality if a flood threat exists.

Kawartha Conservation is asking all residents to keep their children and themselves away from all rivers, streams and lakes as well as water structures such as bridges and culverts as they are extremely dangerous at this time of year.

Kawartha Conservation will continue to monitor the situation on a 24-hour basis and will apprise the public and watershed's municipalities of any changes. If anyone has a concern or knowledge about flooding, please contact Kawartha Conservation at (705) 328-2271 or (705) 344-0155 after hours.

This Flood Advisory will be in effect through Monday, April 7, 2008, when an update or cancellation will be issued.
