Kawartha Region Conservation Authority advises that localized flooding in areas adjacent to the watercourses, low-lying areas, and road ditches is imminent or occurring within the Kawartha Conservation watershed.

Water levels in local rivers and streams are rising quickly in response to the received rainfall and melting snow throughout the watershed.

Some watercourses in southern portion of the watershed (Scugog Township, geographic Township of Manvers) have overtopped their banks (Blackstock Creek, Nonquon River, sections of Pigeon River, East Cross Creek). Road flooding has been reported in some areas.

Rivers and streams in the central portion of the watershed (between Little Britain and Coboconk) are still rising. Water levels will continue to rise throughout the evening. However, the rise of water levels is expected to slow down overnight as a result of below freezing temperatures.

**Municipalities are advised to monitor their local watercourses closely and to be prepared respond to flooding emergencies as they occur.** Residents are advised to monitor their local situation closely and contact municipality if a flood threat exists.

Kawartha Conservation is asking all residents to keep their children and themselves away from all rivers and streams, as they are dangerous at this time of year. Riverbanks and remaining ice cover are extremely unsafe.

Kawartha Conservation will continue to monitor local watercourses on a 24-hour basis and we will apprise the public and watershed's municipalities of any changes. This message will be in effect through Wednesday, April 2, 2008, when an update or cancellation will be issued.
